Tradition obliges: after 2004 and 2014, the Women's EHF EURO is back in Debrecen this year. After hosting the tournament independently in 2004, and then in 2014 jointly with Croatia, this time we will welcome the best women's handball national teams of the continent together with Austria and Switzerland.

We have countless pleasant memories connected to the Főnix Arena: twenty years ago, our women's team qualified for the semi-finals here, and ten years ago fought successfully for the participation in the Final Weekend in Debrecen. There are even more recent, equally joyful moments to look back on: in 2018, the Hungarian team won the Women's Junior World Championship, with the current adult national team captain, Vlagyimir Golovin on the bench, and several players from our current national team on the field. If we cast an even shorter net, the memory of the qualification tournament for the Paris Olympics in April this year lights up, since the Hungarians won all their matches and grabbed their tickets from Főnix Arena to Paris!

This year, the Women's EHF EURO will be held for the first time with 24 national teams, ten of which will play in Hungary in Group A and B matches, as well as in Group I matches in the Main Round, where two teams from Basel, Switzerland will join the four teams qualified from the groups of Debrecen.

This year has already been full of memorable moments from a supporter's point of view, from the Men's EHF EURO through the two qualification tournaments for Paris 2024 to the Women's EHF FINAL4, with the highlight being the Paris Olympics, where we were able to cheer for both of our national teams.

We are always happy to see not only Hungarian but also foreign fans in Debrecen, let's fill the arena together again at an international event and cheer for our beloved national teams!

# WE CATCH THE SPIRIT

Three countries, different handball traditions, but one goal: to give women's handball the attention and popularity it truly deserves and, more importantly, to encourage young people to pursue a professional career in handball. We are making history together with the biggest women's EHF EURO, in the heart of Europe.

Hungary hosts Europe's best handball players for the third time after 2004 and 2014, while Austria and Switzerland make their debut in this role - but they have already organized a men's EHF EURO in Austria (in 2010 and 2020 together with Sweden and Norway), and in Switzerland in 2006.

## MAKING HISTORY

History is guaranteed: 24 teams will participate in the tournament for the first time! Thirty-one nations fought for the twenty places in the qualification as the three host countries and the defending champion, Norway are individual participants of the tournament. In the last stage of the qualification system the thirty-one teams were split into eight groups of four, with the winners and runners-up qualified for the EHF EURO, together with the top four third-placed teams. Faroe Islands and Turkiye qualified for the first time.

## STRONGER TOGETHER

We are uniquely different, but stronger together. We bring what you expect from a tournament, but we add our own unique flavour.

Whether you are on the field as a player, in the stands as a fan, or behind the scenes as an organizer, the personalities and the qualities you bring to the table can be different.

The three organizing committees had one goal: to work as a team, capitalizing on the strengths of each other's handball community and promote women's handball. The world-famous precision of the Swiss, the all-round determination of the Austrians and the passionate creativity of the Hungarians are something everyone can trust.

As a player, you have the choice to be intensely focused or fiercely driven, pushing yourself to give your all for the team. As a teammate, you can embody the sweetness that fosters camaraderie or unleash your spicy side, injecting energy and passion into every game.

**Debrecen** is the second largest city in Hungary, the capital of the northern Great Plain region of the country. The „Calvinist Rome” is nowadays most popular for its thriving culture, excellent higher education and vibrant international student life. The city, rich in monuments as well as modern buildings, shopping streets, pubs and cafes, attracts a lot of attention for its internationally renowned events, too. The central symbol of Debrecen is the Great Reformed Church, so it is worth starting your sightseeing tour here.

Besides the charming parks of the historic city center, Debrecen is home to the Great Forest (Nagyerdő), voted Hungary’s most beautiful forest. The pleasant park within the forest is a well-developed recreation center with plenty of recreational opportunities, including a zoo, an amusement park, a botanical garden, a stadium, and a spa complex called Aquaticum with a medicinal thermal bath, an indoor aquapark, medical and wellness facilities, and Hungary’s most modern outdoor aquapark. The Great Forest is a popular venue of festivals including the Campus Festival at the end of July each year. The city has hosted more than 50 international sporting events over the past two decades in all kinds of sports, and Debrecen has proven to be an excellent organizer.

One of the pride of the city is its women’s handball team, which has been a dominant club in European handball for decades.

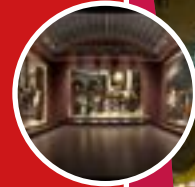

# FŐNIX ARENA

Venue of Group A, Group B and Main Round  
24 (12+12) matches

The Főnix Arena has been one of Hungary's most used facilities for cultural and sporting events since its opening. The arena's floor is surrounded by a retractable tribune system on all sides and has excellent facilities. The arena is connected to the neighbouring Imre Hódos Sports Hall via an underground passage, so it can be used for training and warm-ups during major events. The arena has also hosted the Women's Handball European Championship in 2004 and 2014, and has hosted numerous musicians. (e.g. Joe Cocker, Bryan Adams, Lenny Kravitz, Paco de Lucía, Sting).

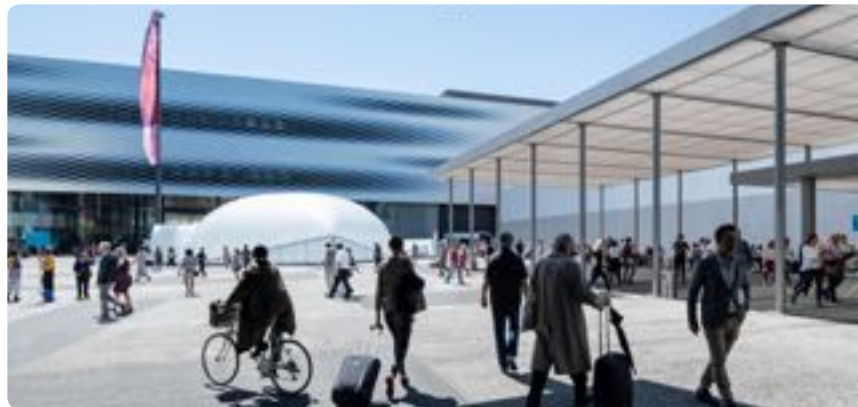


## Cultural highlights

But Basel is ahead in terms of culture as well: the „Cultural Capital of Switzerland” is home to almost 40 museums, some of them world-famous, including the Kunstmuseum Basel and the Fondation Beyeler, within an area of just 37 square kilometres. Art Basel, the most important fair for modern and contemporary art, attracts art enthusiasts from all over the world to Basel every year (16-22 June 2025).

Another highlight is the Eurovision Song Contest, which rocks the city on the banks of the Rhine in May: the three live shows of the world’s biggest music competition will take place in the St. Jakobshalle on 13, 15 and 17 May 2025. On the day of the final, an „Arena Plus” will be set up in St. Jakob-Park with concerts and live broadcasts, accompanied by a comprehensive programme in the city.

In 2025, music fans can also look forward to the Jazzfestival Basel (26 April-25 May), the European Youth Choir Festival Basel (28 May-1 June) and the Baloise Session in autumn. Classical music enthusiasts are recommended to visit the Stadtcasino Basel, which is home to one of the best music halls in the world. For fans of opera, theatre and ballet, a visit to the multi-award-winning Theater Basel is a must.

# ST. JAKOBSHALLE

The St. Jakobshalle Basel is one of the most modern multifunctional halls in Europe. It is 20,000 square metres in size and has been hosting international concerts, major productions and sporting events for over 45 years.

The hall is home to the Swiss Indoors men's tennis tournament and every year, the world's elite badminton players meet here for Yonex Swiss Open. Since 2010, an international equestrian tournament (Longines CHI Classics Basel) is also held here every year. This is the first time that the cream of European women's handball visits the arena, which already hosted the men's tournament in 2006 and the World Championship in 1986.

Some of the biggest stars of international music life (e.g. Bob Dylan, Tina Turner, Queen, Muse, Johnny Cash) have already performed at St. Jakobshalle Basel. In 2025 the arena will host the Eurovision Song Contest.

The Olympiahalle, part of the „Olympiaworld Innsbruck“ complex, was already standing in 1964 – built for the first Olympic Winter Games hosted by Austria. Twelve years later, in 1976, the hall hosted Olympic Games again; with figure skating and ice hockey programmes at both Games.

The hall has hosted a number of major sporting events, such as the Ice Hockey World Championship and the European Volleyball and Handball Championships. With a capacity of 6,000 spectators, combined with state-of-the-art facilities and services, Olympiaworld is the perfect venue for event organizers and sport event operators. Innsbruck’s ice hockey team played its games in the big hall between 1994 and 2005, nowadays the most important play-off games are held in the Olympiahalle.

World stars such as Pink, Joe Cocker, Simply Red, the Uriah Heep, the Rolling Stones, Cher, Lenny Kravitz or Falco have all performed here.

# WIENER STADTHALLE

Venue of Main Round and Final Weekend | 17 matches

With over 300 events and around one million visitors a year, the Wiener Stadthalle is Austria's largest event center and one of Europe's top ten arenas. Designed by Roland Rainer, it opened its doors in 1958: „A UFO has landed in Vienna” - said the opening speech. Since then, the Wiener Stadthalle has been a living bastion of events in Austria.

The Wiener Stadthalle is a concert hall, a show stage, an event and motorsport arena, an exhibition and congress center, a TV studio, a circus, and a venue for major international sporting events. The site has six halls which can be rented separately or together, making it one of Europe's most important multi-purpose event centres.

Of course, over the past six decades, it has hosted many international pop stars, such as Britney Spears, Lenny Kravitz or ZZ Top, and it was the venue for the 60th Eurovision Song Contest.

The facility is home to the Erste Bank Open, one of Europe's most prestigious tennis tournament since 1974. In 2020, it hosted the Men's EHF EURO Group B and one of the main group matches.

# Women's EHF EURO Milestones

1994

## • The journey begins

The first Women's EHF EURO matches are played in Germany. On the day 25 September 1994 Denmark wins the first European Championship in Berlin, in front of 4,000 people, with 12 teams, three months after the first Men's EHF EURO in Portugal. In the bronze medal game, Norway beat Hungary.



## Denmark—double

Denmark hosted the second EHF EURO and defended their title, defeating rivals Norway in the final. The dominant player of the era, Anja Andersen, was named the tournament's best player. Surprisingly, Austria won the bronze medal, beating Germany 30-23 on the final day.



1996

## • 1st gold for Norway

In the Netherlands, Norway broke Denmark's dominance and won its first European Championship title, followed by eight more (!) until 2022. They beat Denmark 28-19 in the group stage, that was the first Danish defeat in the history of the EURO-s. Austria could play for a medal again, but the bronze went to Hungary. The top scorer was still Austria's Austra Fridrikas (68 goals), a world-class player who had previously played for the Soviet and then Lithuanian national teams.



## Extra time in the final

Hungary became the first non-Scandinavian nation to win the EHF EURO title. In the final in Bucharest, Hungary defeated Ukraine after a huge battle, after extra time, with Ágnes Farkas scoring 14 goals. Hungarian Beata Siti was voted the best player of the tournament. The Scandinavian teams did not make it to the top five, Norway finished 5th while Denmark 10th. The bronze medal went to Russia, they beat the host Romania.

## • 16 teams!

Denmark hosted for the second time and again defeated Norway to become European champions (25-22) under head coach Jan Pytlick. It was the first tournament to be organized with 16 teams, with more than 80,000 fans in attendance. The French won their first medal by beating Russia in the bronze medal match.

## Lunde's first gold

Hungary hosted for the first time: the group matches were played in Győr, Békéscsaba and Zalaegerszeg, the semi-finals in Győr and Debrecen, and the Final Weekend was in Budapest. The Hungarian team finished third, Bojana Radulovic was the top scorer, and the European title went to Norway (where goalkeeper Katrine Lunde Haraldsen won gold for the first time). The final was

a rematch with Denmark in front of 10,000 spectators. A new record was set with 124 800 fans in attendance.



## New hall for European handball

Skopje, the capital of Macedonia, got a new arena for the European Handball Championship: the Boris Trajkovski Hall was built for this occasion (the other host city was Ohrid). The tournament was won by the Beijing Olympics winners Norway (under legendary national captain Marik Breivik), beating Spain, the team reaching the medal stage for the first time.

## New champions on the list

After the Men's EHF EURO in January, Serbia hosted the women's tournament after the Netherlands withdrew from the event in June 2012. A couple of months after Montenegro lost to Norway in the London Olympic final, the South Slavs came back to win the European title after two overtimes, with Katarina Bulatovic in superb form. The bronze medal match was also decided after extra time, Hungary beat hosts Serbia.

## Back to back for Norway

The tournament qualified for the 2008 Beijing Olympics, hosted by Sweden and attended by more than 500 media professionals. Norway, led by Gro Hammerseng, defended their title by defeating legendary master Evgeny Trefilov's Russian team in the final. Denmark again slipped out of the last four, while France won bronze again.



## 215 752 spectators

For the first time in the history of the EHF EURO-s, the tournament was hosted by two countries, and indeed by the two most successful nations, Denmark and Norway. For the fourth time in a row, Norway came out on top, but not by beating the Danes, but by defeating Sweden in the final. Sweden won their first medal, adding a bronze to their medal collection four years later. Only 31 goals were scored in the bronze medal match, Romania spoiling the mood of the Herring crowd by beating Denmark 16-15.



### Almost the Netherlands

Sweden won the opportunity to host the tournament against Türkiye in 2012. Dutch star Nycke Groot was named MVP, but his team ultimately fell to the irresistible Norwegians and 12-goal scorer Nora Mørk in the final. The French won another medal (a bronze) after ten years, again in Sweden.



### Croatia is in our heart

At the EHF Congress in Stockholm, Austria, Switzerland and Hungary were selected as the Women's EHF EURO 2024 hosts, beating the Czech-Polish-Slovak bid by 28-21. The EHF EURO in Denmark were held in Herning and Kolding without spectators due to the coronavirus pandemic (Norway has withdrawn from the event due to the situation). Norway again came out on top by beating the French, but the big march was made by the Croatians, who surprisingly went all the way to the bronze medal, beating Denmark 25-29, with Ana Debelić also making the All Star team.

### Queen Isabelle Guldén

Once again two countries hosted, Hungary for the second time, Croatia for the first. Sweden's Isabelle Guldén was both top scorer and MVP as her team beat defending champions Montenegro in the bronze medal match, setting the tone for the home EHF EURO two years later. Norway returned to the throne with their sixth success, while Spain were silver medallists again.



### 14 000 fans at the final

France hosted the EHF EURO for the first time, with Paris, Nantes, Nancy, Brest and Montbeliard, which was watched by 237,000 spectators. In the final in Paris, the French won in front of 14,000 people (new record) against the Russians, while the bronze went to the Dutch, who beat the Romanians. The eight All-Star team members and MVP were from nine nations, while the top scorer was from a tenth nation, Serbia's Katarina Krpež Šlezak (50 goals). Norway failed to make the semifinals after 18 years.



### Hvala, Jovanka!

Three countries – Slovenia, Montenegro and North Macedonia – hosted the EHF EURO for the first time. Ljubljana, Celje, Podgorica and Skopje hosted matches, Norway won their 9th gold by beating Denmark in the final. Katrine Lunde became European champion for the sixth time. The bronze went to one of the hosts, Montenegro, after a crazy match against the French, where handball, our beautiful sport celebrated legendary Montenegrin player, Jovanka Radicevic.

# THE BEST MOMENTS OF EHF EUROS

## The extra time winners

Hungary and Montenegro could tell you a lot about what unbelievable excitement means. In 2000 in Bucharest, the first gold medal game was decided in extra time, with Hungary beating Ukraine by 32-30. 12 years later in Serbia, Montenegro beat Norway by 34-31 in double overtime in the final, the only double overtime in the history of finals. Interestingly, the bronze medal at this EHF EURO was also decided after extra time, with Hungary beating hosts Serbia by 41-38. In the last tournament, the bronze medal was also decided in extra time, Montenegro beat France by 27-25.



## Nora Mørk soars — in the company of the top scorers

Norway's Nora Mørk has been crowned the EHF EURO's top scorer three times. She scored 53 goals in 2016, 52 in 2020 and 50 in 2022, leading her team with 12 goals against the Netherlands in the final in Sweden. Ágnes Farkas scored even more than her, 14 times in the final of 2000's EURO. The Hungarian national team's star became the top scorer of the EHF EURO two years later in Denmark with 58 goals, and was also at the first EHF EURO in 1994, when she scored 48 goals. Hungary's Bojana Radulovic scored the most goals in a single tournament in 2004, with 72, followed by Austra Fridrikas and Simona Gogirla. The Austrian left back scored 68 goals in 1998 in the Netherlands, while the Romanian did the same in 2000 at home.

## Cristina Neagu: over 300 goals!

Two years ago, Romanian left back Cristina Neagu became the most successful player in the history of the EHF EURO's, including the men's, scoring a total of 303 goals. In the women's competition, she took over the top spot in 2018, overtaking Hungary's Ágnes Farkas (205) and Germany's Grit Jurack (194) as the all-time leaders. Since then, Sweden's Isabelle Gullén, Spain's Carmen Martín, Norway's Nora Mørk and Montenegro's Jovanka Radicevic have all surpassed the 200-goal milestone. In 2022, during the last EHF EURO of her career, she passed Icelandic men player Gudjon Valur Sigurdsson, who scored 288 goals in EHF EURO's history. The Romanian star was the top scorer only once, in 2010, when she scored 53 goals and her national team won bronze in Denmark.

## Katrine on top of Europe

A unique fact: Norwegian legend Katrine Lunde has reached the top six times with the national team, the last time in 2022, at the age of 42. The goalkeeper, with more than 350 caps, is a three-time Olympic champion and two-time world champion, having been at the 2002 EHF EURO where she won silver medal, as well as in 2012. She was selected for the All-Star team in 2008, 2010 and 2012. Seven players have won five EHF EUROs, all from the nine-time winners Norway: Karoline Dyhre Breivang, Linn-Kristin Riegelhuth-Koren, Kari Aalvik Grimsbø, Camilla Herrem, Marit Malm Frafjord, Stine Oftedal and Nora Mørk.

## Icelandic record among the head coaches

Iceland's Thorir Hergeirsson has been European champion five times with Norway, reaching the top in 2010, 2014, 2016, 2020 and 2022. He has also won the Olympics twice (most recently in Paris this year) and the World Championship three times with the team. With five firsts, he has overtaken Marik Breivik, who won four European titles as national team captain with Norway and whom he replaced on the bench in 2009 (he had been assistant coach with the national team since 2001).

## 14 060: French record and domestic gold

France beat Russia by 24-21 in the final of the 2018 EHF EURO after a thrilling game, winning the gold for the first time in their history at home. The game was played in front of 14 060 spectators at the Bercy Arena, the highest attendance in the history of the EHF EUROs. The bronze medal match also attracted more than 13,000 fans, while the semi-final between the Netherlands and France attracted 12,000. The 2016 final, Netherlands-Norway in Gothenburg, was watched by 11 037 spectators, and 11 000 fans were at the Kombank Arena in Belgrade for the 2012 bronze medal match between Hungary and Serbia. France were the second team to win the gold medal at home, Denmark having done it twice before. Norway were co-hosts with Denmark in 2010, winning the final in Herning, Denmark. Germany also reached the final as hosts at the first tournament in 1994 but lost out to Denmark.



## Croatia surprises Europe

It was quite a march that the Croatian girls put on in Denmark in 2020. The EHF EURO was held without spectators due to the coronavirus pandemic, and perhaps because of that, the Croats played freely, beating Hungary (24-22), the Netherlands (27-25) and Serbia (25-24) in the group stage! Romania (25-20) and Germany also capitulated (23-20) in the Main Round. Although they lost the semi-final against France, they beat the hosts Denmark 25-19 in the bronze medal match. Ana Debelić was also nominated for the All Star team, while Čamila Mičijević finished third on the scoring charts with 35 goals. Croatia became the 14th nation to win a medal at the EHF EUROs.

# THROWBACK TO 2022

## NORWAY TOPS EUROPE – AGAIN

**The record holder of the EHF EUROs did not slow down in 2022, at the fifteenth continental tournament: Norway won the gold medal for the ninth time by defeating Denmark. Slovenia, Montenegro and North Macedonia hosted the last EHF EURO, with 16 national teams taking part.**

For the first time, three countries could host the Women's EHF EURO in 2022. In 2014, Croatia and Hungary were co-hosts, the other tournaments were organized in one country. In Slovenia, the Zlatorog Arena in Celje and the Arena Stožice in Ljubljana, in Montenegro the Moraca Sports Center in Podgorica, and in North Macedonia the Boris Trajkovski Sport Center in Skopje were the venues. Unusually, the tournament took place earlier rather than in December, bypassing football World Cup in Qatar.

During the group matches, Norway, France and the host Montenegro finished with 100 percent records, and Sweden also won its own group. Of the hosts, only North Macedonia failed to qualify for the Main Round, where Slovenia also qualified after defeating Serbia in a huge battle in the last group game.

During the Main Round, only French women managed to maintain their unblemished record after winning each of their matches in Skopje. Similarly, Denmark, who lost to Slovenia in the group stage, won all their matches and also defeated Norway to win the Main Round group. In the semi-finals in Ljubljana, Denmark won 27-23 against Montenegro, thereby reaching the final again after 2004. On the other side, Norway beat the French 28-20, who were preparing for their third final in a row, but fell behind. One of the host nations, Montenegro, was the lucky winners, beating France 27-25 in extra time in the bronze medal match after an incredible excitement, Montenegro's legendary player Jovanka Radicevic retired from the national team on this day.

In the Scandinavian final, the Danes led at half-time, but in the end the Norwegians won their ninth European championship title, led by Nora Mørk, who scored eight goals. Legendary goalkeeper Katrine Lunde won her sixth EHF EURO gold medal at the age of 42. The medallists qualified for the 2023 World Championship, and the winner for the Paris Olympics.

The Romanian league led the EHF EURO 2022 with the highest number of participants. 49 members of 11 different Romanian clubs have played for 12 different countries. Of the clubs, Slovenia's Krim Ljubljana sent the most players, 13. 39 players from the Danish league, 38 from the French and 34 from the German took part in the tournament, only 13 from the winning Norwegian league were there at the event. No one from the sixth-placed Netherlands was at the European Championship, with all the national team members playing abroad. The final set a television viewing record in the participating countries, with 1.7 million people in Denmark and 1.1 million viewers in Norway.

The tournament will be held at nine (!) venues. The Main Round will be held in Oslo or Trondheim in Norway and either Copenhagen or Herning in Denmark. The Final Weekend will take place in the Telenor Arena in Oslo.

In November 2021, during the Congress of the Federation, the EHF awarded the 17th Men's EHF EURO to the Swedish-Norwegian-Danish bid.

The tournament will be held in four venues in four cities: one in Denmark (Herning, Groups A and B), one in Norway (Oslo, Groups C and D), and two in Sweden (Malmö and Kristianstad, Groups E and F). The Main Round will take place in Herning and Malmö, with the Danish city hosting the Final Weekend.

## **Men's EHF EURO 2028**

13–30 January 2028

As only the Spain/Portugal/Switzerland bid remaining, the 14th EHF Extraordinary Congress on 20 November 2021 unanimously selected the host of the next tournament.

### **Venues of the tournament:**

Seven cities from the three countries have been proposed: from Portugal, Lisbon will be the center, Basel, Lausanne and Zürich to host matches in Switzerland, while Valencia, Barcelona and Madrid have been put forward from Spain.

Barcelona's Palau St. Jordi, Madrid's Wanda Stadium and the home of Real Madrid, Santiago Bernabéu, have also been mooted as potential venues for the final weekend.

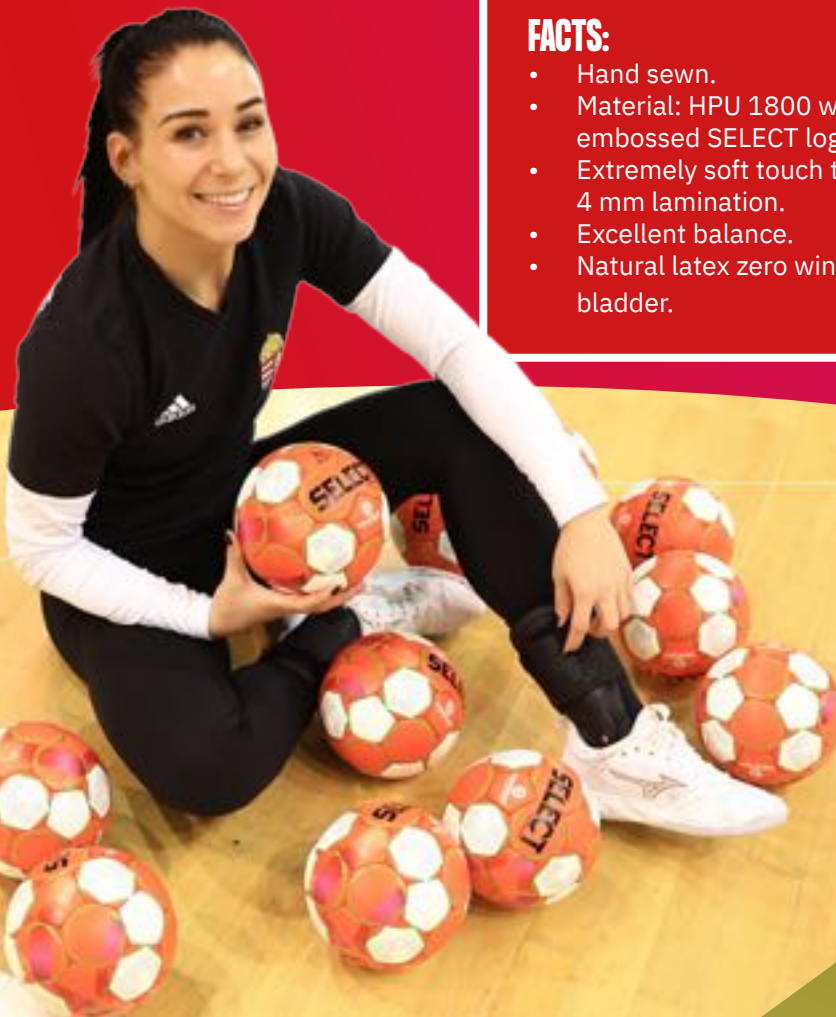

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

## OFFICIATING TECHNOLOGY

The referees in a match have full authority to enforce the Rules of the Game, consequently being exposed to potential controversies when it comes to interpreting a given situation. The use of technological officiating aids aims to enhance the overall quality of refereeing in handball.

Through improved decision-making on the part of referees, the integrity of the game is protected and more qualitative content is produced for fans.

## THE EHF WILL BE IMPLEMENTING THE FOLLOWING OFFICIATING TECHNOLOGIES AT THIS EURO:

### GOAL-LINE TECHNOLOGY PROOF

Goal-line technology proof is a system of cameras installed on the crossbar of each of the goals, offering views of the goal line from two different angles. These images are accessible for the referees on a screen at the Video Review Table (VRT). On their request, the referees can consult the images if they are not completely sure whether the ball has fully crossed the goal line or not. The system has already been used at several EHF club and national team competitions.

### GOAL-LIGHT TECHNOLOGY

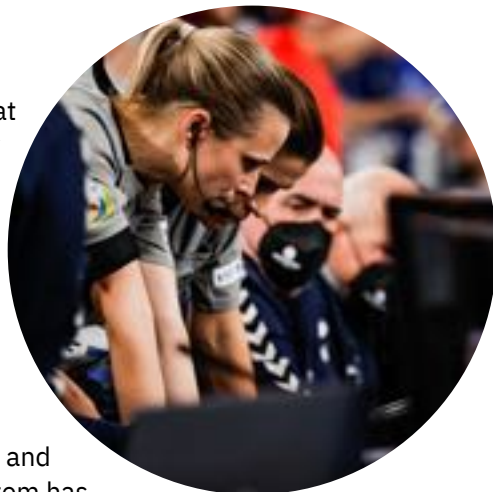
A series of (red) LED lights installed on the rear bars of each goal light up simultaneously with the buzzer sound for team timeouts and at the end of each half. The system has been used at several events in the last years and is already well known. Any decision in connection with the possible use of goal-light technology during the matches is the responsibility of the referees and holds the same status as any other decision made by the referees on the court.





## **VIDEO REPLAY (VR) TECHNOLOGY**

VR technology is a video recording of an action that can be played back (in slow motion) immediately after the action has been completed, offering the referees the possibility to watch a situation at the VRT before reaching a decision. Referees can immediately watch a situation at the VRT if they were not able to see the complete action on the court and wish to check again before reaching a decision.



VR is accessible for the referees and the delegates, and its use is the decision of only those parties. The system has been successfully used at EHF competitions since 2019.

Any decision in connection with the possible use of VRT during the matches is the responsibility of the referees (and/or delegates) and holds the same status as any other decision taken by the referees on the court. The goal of the VR is to ensure a fair and just outcome in EURO matches.

### **THESE ARE THE SITUATIONS IN WHICH THE VR CAN BE USED:**

- Goal or no goal.
- Serious and unfair actions.
- Punishments and red cards.
- Faulty substitutions and mistaken identity.
- Simulations.
- Game-changing situations in the last 30 seconds of the match.
- Timeout buzzer misuse.

## **SUBSTITUTION AREA CONTROL TECHNOLOGY**

The substitution area control technology system (micro cameras) provides a detailed view of both substitution areas, offering video assistance in case of decisions that concern the substitution areas.

## **ELECTRONIC TEAM TIMEOUT REQUEST SYSTEM (BUZZER)**

An electronic team timeout system, which means that each team can directly request a team timeout by pressing a button on an electronic device, can be used at the EURO (instead of the green team timeout cards). The two buttons are linked to the official scoreboard system. When one of the buttons is pressed, the match time is immediately stopped. The timeout is also indicated via an audio signal (buzzer), to ensure that all parties are aware of it. The buzzers are placed on either side of the Table, toward the substitution areas of each team.

## **REFEREE RADIO COMMUNICATION SYSTEM**

VOGO's Vokkero Elite wireless communication system will be used by the referees to stay in constant contact with each other (and the VR Table) and be able to communicate about all crucial decisions during a match.

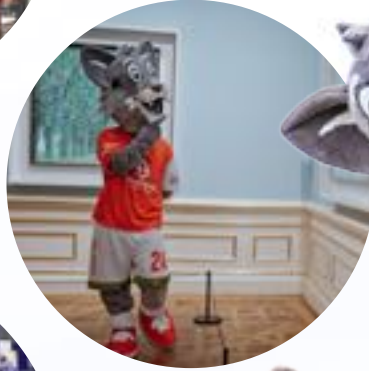
The wildcat, which can be found in all three countries, combines three fundamental qualities of handball: speed, agility and intelligence.

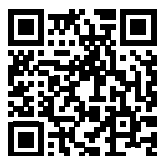

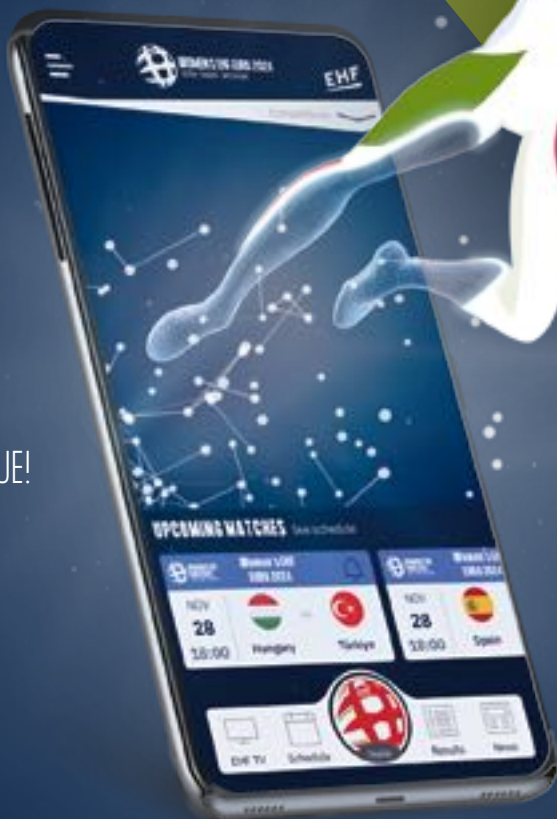
